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What is God's mission in this world? God's story, the Bible tells us exactly what he is up to!

If we increasingly know and respond to God's mission, then we will see and experience the building and coming of God's Kingdom.

This study requires commitment. A commitment to the Bible. A commitment of time. A commitment to each other as we hear the mission of God and understand our place in it.

OPENING QUESTION

What is "the gospel"? How would you explain it in one or two sentences to someone who has never heard this word?

SETTING THE SCENE

The gospel is the whole story of God and God's people, the story that goes from first creation to new creation and pivots on the coming, death, resurrection and going of Jesus.

It is a story that is an invitation to be a part of God's plan to remake a people and place. A kingdom and a people. A King and His people.

The Bible is the story of God and his creation. It is about the creator God who established a world, a kingdom. It is about a people who God created to live in this world and have relationship with him. To live as representative of God but also to look after his creation. It is about a debt, when people disobeyed God and had to leave their place with God. It is about God who sort to lead his people back to himself and their rightful place through prophets, priests, and kings. It is a story of people's failures, so God sent his Son to do what no one else could do, to rescue everyone from their disobedience. It is a story about God sending his Son Jesus as the Messiah, the King to re-establish his kingdom. It is a story of a people who are called to follow their king. King Jesus.

God is writing a story. As one writer put it, history is HIS-STORY.

READ SCRIPTURE

Have someone read LUKE 4:14-21

PROVIDE OPPORTUNITY TO SHARE

What were the main truths you heard from the message on Sunday?

USE THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS TO GUIDE YOUR DISCUSSIONS

- Who is the Bible fundamentally about, or asked another way, who is the main character of the Bible?
 - How can we know this?
- There are repeated truths spoken and lived across the Bible story.
 - What are some of these?
 - Where do you see these revealed across God's story?
- What do you understand it to mean that the Bible is the progressive revelation of God?



- If the Bible is God's progressive revelation, the how has God revealed His mission across the Bible story, His story?
- In LUKE 4:18-19, Jesus begins his public ministry by announcing his mission statement. How did Jesus see this fulfilled? LUKE 4:21
- How does God's mission, as revealed progressively across his story, the Bible, and specifically in LUKE 4:18-21, challenge your understanding of the God's mission?
